A weaver made cloth by using thread of -

wool
goat's hair
camel's hair
flax
cotton

The weaver knew how to dye the thread in beautiful colors - purple, yellow, blue, red and white.

Paul was a special kind of weaver. He wove goat's hair into tent cloth. He was called a tentmaker. On his missionary journey he found two other tentmakers in Corinth. Their names were Priscilla and Aquila. (See Acts 18:1-3) Paul stayed in this home. He used their loom and made tentcloth there.

When the tabernacle was built as a house for God, there were weavers who made the curtains for the temple.
