PERFUME









Perfume was made and sold in Bible times. Do you remember the merchants travelling to Egypt? His brothers sold Joseph to these merchants as a slave. The camels were carrying a load of spice and balm and myrrh to Egypt. (See Genesis 37:25) In Egypt these would be made into perfume or perhaps incense.

Spices were mixed with olive oil and used in several ways by the people of Israel.

- 1. Put on the body of someone who was dead. When the body of Jesus was taken down from the cross, Nicodemus brought a kind of perfume to be used when His body was wrapped in linen cloth. (See John 19:38-40)

 Women went to Jesus' tomb early in the morning.

 They carried spices to anoint the body of Jesus.

 (Mark 16:1-2) To do this showed their love for Jesus.
- 2. A person used perfume to anoint the head of someone he wanted to honor. Who anointed Jesus' head?

 (See Matthew 26:7; Luke 7:37; John 12:3)
