

Fig trees are the most

common of all fruit trees in

Israel. This tree will grow

wherever there is only a

little soil. Often it was

grown along the edge of a

vineyard. Not much care is

required. It grows everywhere

from the Lebanon mountains to

the Dead Sea.

The fig tree is not a tall tree. Once in a while it will get 25 feet tall. The largest crop of figs are ripe in August and September. It is pruned (cut back) sharply each year.

TURN CARD OVER

Figs were eaten as fresh fruit for many months each year. Some figs were dried in the sun and then packed away in pottery jars. Some women made a kind of "cake" by pressing the dried figs together very hard.
