BUT GROW! II Peter 3:11-18

Introduction:

- A. How many parents have ever said to their children, "When are you going to grow up?"
 - 1. "It is time you grew up."
 - 2. Usually we were speaking of maturity...
- B. Christians also should grow ...
 - 1. If we do not grow we can be deceived with false doctrine...
 - 2. If we do not grow we will not go forward...
 - 3. The way to avoid spiritual decline is spiritual growth...
 - a. Creation says, "Grow or you will become weaker and weaker..."
 - b. Even our bodies are being plucked daily as we lose and atom here and an atom there...
 - 4. In the end, the laws of death will claim all that is mortal...
- C. How sad when the body stops growing:
 - 1. Doctors are constantly trying to find out why some children stop growing....
 - a. Parents get concerned..
 - b. They want at lease normal growth...
 - c. Some of our kids must be on "Miracle Growth."

- 2. Growth is necessary for life:
 - a. True of nations, corporations, organizations and even churches...
 - b. Death is the penalty of non-growth.
- 3. In the third epistle of John he tells his beloved Gaius that he prays he might prosper and be in health even as his soul prospers...
 - a. What if our physical bodies should have only enough power to correspond to our spiritual health...?
 - b. We might see the extent of our lack of spiritual growth...
- 4. I ask you this morning, "Are you growing?"
 - a. I am speaking about you personally...
 - b. Not your friend, your ministry, but you...
- D. In order for the Christians to stand in Peter's day, he gives this direction:
 - 1. "But grow in grace..."
 - 2. The way to stand steadfast is to grow...
 - 3. Look at verse 17:

Ye therefore, beloved, seeing ye know *these things* before, beware lest ye also, being led away with the error of the wicked, fall from your own stedfastness.

- a. The way to stand is to go forward...
- b. The way to stand is to progress...

c. The way to stay alive is to grow...

I. You Can Grow

- A. The exciting news about growth is that you can grow:
 - 1. There is no joy like growth:
 - a. Children
 - b. Teens
 - c. Young Christians
 - 2. But, does not everything eventually stop growing?
 - a. Physically?
 - b. Intellectually?
 - c. Socially?
 - d. Spiritually?
 - 3. If we base our growth on the curve, we will eventually decline...
 - a. All curves come down...
 - b. We should be on a straight line in growth...
 - c. "I'm pressing on the upward way,
 New heights I'm gaining everyday;
 Still praying as I onward bound,
 'Lord plant my feet on higher ground.""

B. You can grow in GRACE:

- 1. To grow in grace is to grow in our sanctification...
 - a. There are degrees in the development of grace...
 - b. So, there is such a thing as growing in grace:
- 2. This growth is not something measured just in years of time...
 - a. I would expect someone saved for several years to know more about grace than someone who has been saved a few months...
 - b. However, not necessarily...
 - c. Some grow faster than others...
 - d. I have experienced growth spurts of grace in my life ...
- C. Growth in grace is not something you can measure by feelings:
 - 1. You may feel that you are not growing when in reality you are...
 - a. Some people confuse enthusiasm and energy with growth in grace...
 - b. Some young preachers with all the energy to build a church get confused later when that enthusiasm is gone...
 - c. Same is true with young Christians...
 - 1) "Enthusiasm is gone so I must no be growing..."
 - 2) *Not so...*
 - 2. When you start a fire you put the kindling at the bottom:

- a. Burns brightly...
- b. Soon the kindling is burned and the hardwood catches fire and flame dies down...
- c. There may be less light and fire, but there is more heat...
- 3. This is the way it is with grace...
 - a. It begins with a flame and lays hold on the imagination and passions...
 - b. Later grace appeals more to the soul and makes the Christian a solid piece of coal...

Leviticus 16:11-12

- 11 And Aaron shall bring the bullock of the sin offering, which *is* for himself, and shall make an atonement for himself, and for his house, and shall kill the bullock of the sin offering which *is* for himself:
- 12 And he shall take a censer full of burning **coals** of fire from off the altar before the LORD, and his hands full of sweet incense beaten small, and bring *it* within the vail:
 - c. He is no longer a little flame rising up to heaven where a puff of wind can blow it out, but a strong coal and the wind only causes it to become hotter...
 - 4. Do not judge your growth by your feelings...
 - C. Do not judge your growth by your circumstances:
 - 1. Some of God's plants grow best in darkness:
 - a. Today you are in the Valley of Depression, that dose not mean you are not growing...
 - b. That may be the best place to grow in grace...
 - 2. Our worst circumstances may be our best places to grow...

- D. On the other had, do not think that you are growing because you are doing more:
 - 1. Just because you are doing and laboring, dose not mean you are growing...
 - 2. Remember the church at Ephesus?
 - 3. Of course, if you are doing nothing, that is a sure sign that you are not growing...
- E. The main point is, "You Can Grow."
 - 1. If you can grow....
 - 2. You should grow...

II. You Must Grow

Psalm 92:12

- 12 The righteous shall flourish like the palm tree: he shall **grow** like a cedar in Lebanon.
 - A. Remember, when you stop growing, decline starts:
 - 1. The moment you become satisfied...
 - 2. Never accept your present spiritual condition as your best...
 - 3. Remember that God was "The God of Jacob."
 - a. God was not content with Jacob....
 - b. God is not content with me or you...
 - c. Jacob, the sup-planter, became Israel, the Prince of God...
 - 4. That is what God's grace can do...

- B. You may not be totally responsible for what you are, but we are responsible for what we remain...
 - 1. The grace of God saved us and the grace of God can change us...

"What a wonderful change in my life has been wrought, Since Jesus came into my heart; I have light in my soul for which long I have sought; Since Jesus came into my heart."

- 2. There is no reason why you should not grow...
- C. You Can Grow You Must Grow

III. How You Should Grow

- A. Vitally
 - 1. Make this a vital part of your life...
 - a. Priority...
 - b. We neglect our spiritual lives so much...
 - 2. First, it is vital that we are alive we cannot grow unless we are alive...
 - a. Growth depends on life...
 - b. "He that hath the Son hath life and he that hath not the Son of God hath not life."
 - 3. It does not matter about your environment or your

circumstances, you will never grow unless you have life...

4. This is vital...

B. Nutritionally

- 1. See to it that you get the right nutrition...
 - a. Wrong nutrition or lack of good nutrition will cause stunted growth...
 - b. What kind of diet are you on?
- 2. If you digest what you read in newspapers, magazines and see on television, you are not going to grow in grace...
 - a. A sea gull was caught and caged and fed only grain for several months...
 - 1) Its natural food, of course, is soft fish...
 - 2) The sea gull died and it was found that all the hard grain had changed its stomach into a gizzard...
 - b. What have you been digesting?
- 3. The Bible says, "Eat ye that which is good."
 - a. "Taste and see that the Lord is good..."
 - b. I Peter 2:2
- 2 As newborn babes, desire the sincere milk of the word, that ye may grow thereby:
 - b. No book can help you grow in grace like the Bible...

- 1) It will build you up...
- 2) It will edify you...
- 3) It will help you to be thoroughly furnished to every good work...that is grace...
- 4. Grow Vitally Grow Nutritionally

C. Atmospherically

- 1. A couple had been spending an evening in a disco with all the smoking and drinking...
 - a, They walked outside...
 - b. "What is that I smell?"
 - c. "That's fresh air!"
 - d. They had been in the wrong atmosphere...
- 2. We need to be careful of the atmosphere in which we live...
 - a. A lot of air these days is polluted...
 - b. Not the place to grow in grace...
 - c. Be careful where you go...
- 3. Get some deep breaths of heavenly air and spend time in prayer with our God...
 - a. Jesus did...
 - b. "Take time to be holy,

Speak oft with thy Lord;
Abide in Him always,
And feed on His word,
By looking to Jesus,
Like Him thou shalt be;
Thy friends in thy conduct,
His likeness shall see."

- 4. Grow atmospherically
- D. Ergonomically

II Corinthians 9:8

8 And God *is* able to make all **grace** abound toward you; that ye, always having all sufficiency in all *things*, may abound to every good work:

- 1. Show me a person who is not working for Christ, and I will show you one who is not growing in grace...
 - a. A working person will become a hungry person...
 - b. Same is true with a spiritually working person...
 - 1) They are hungry for the word of God...
 - 2) Hunger for the grace of God...
- 2. What work are doing for the Master?
 - a. Jesus said, "My Father worketh hitherto and I work."

- b. Are you working?
- c. You can work without growing, but you cannot grow without working.
